





AL!VE Hybrid Conference

Each year, AL!VE partners with Better Impact to host a hybrid conference that offers four 60-minute workshops centered on a particular theme trending in the volunteer sector. The conference is live-streamed internationally throughout the day and provides the opportunity to learn locally through host-site partners.

In 2023, 44 host sites from North America and Canada attended with 1,000 attendees. This year's topic was "Leveraging Technology in A Human World: Inclusively, Responsibly, Creatively".

AL!VE Emerging Leaders Mentor Program

Participants come to the mentorship program from many backgrounds, years of experience in the field, and goals for their professional development. ALIVE's volunteer facilitators use a variety of tools to match mentors and mentees based on common goals, experience, and industry. Each session culminates in a virtual celebration of accomplishments. Here, all of the participating mentees and mentors reconvene to share both the professional wins and challenges they experienced together.

In 2023, AL!VE paired 22 matches to provide mentorship, professional development opportunities, and resource sharing for leaders of volunteer engagement!



SERVICE ENTERPRISE



AL!VE's Service Enterprise Program impacts volunteer engagement professionals and their organizations to achieve strategic volunteer engagement from coast to coast. In partnership with our Service Enterprise Training and Implementation Partners:

- 77 organizations took the research-based diagnostic that focuses on volunteer engagement culture and practices and participated in cross-functional multilevel debrief conversations with their organization
- 45 new organizations achieve national accreditation in strategic volunteer engagement
- 16 organizations reaccredited for another three years
- more than 700 organizations being accredited during the lifetime of the program
- · 30 individuals attended our AL!VE Academy
- 122 Service Enterprises took our annual survey. 83% said the outcomes of participating in Service Enterprise were worth the time and effort they invested
- Updated curriculum and training materials to be more inclusive
- 20 individuals participated in our Service Enterprise
 Train the Trainer and New Hub Sessions
